# Twelfth Night

#### Synopsis

Duke Orsino is madly in love with the Countess Olivia and vows to win her. Viola, shipwrecked in a savage storm off of Illyria's coast, believes she has lost her twin brother Sebastian. Disguised as a boy and under the pseudonym Cesario, Viola becomes a page for the Duke Orsino. The Duke somewhat fruitlessly courts Olivia, who mourns her father and brother. Viola, bearing love letters to Olivia on behalf of Duke Orsino, piques Olivia's interest; Olivia sends her steward, Malvolio, to take her ring to Cesario. Viola, with chagrin, sees that Cesario has caught the eye of Olivia, made even more intriguing as Viola is attracted to Duke Orsino.

Sebastian, having survived the wreck, believes Viola to have perished. Antonio, a one-time foe of the Duke, comes to Sebastian's aid. Olivia's uncle Sir Toby Belch connives to set up Sir Andrew Aguecheek as Olivia's suitor. Sir Toby conspires with Maria (Olivia's maid) and Feste (a jester) to make a fool of Malvolio—Maria writes Malvolio to dupe him into thinking Olivia has become enamored of him. Malvolio, caught up in the shenanigans, is locked up as a madman.

Meanwhile, Sir Toby goads Sir Andrew into duelling Cesario (Viola) as she takes leave of Olivia, who is infatuated with Cesario even as Viola trumpets the Duke's merits. As the two reluctantly prepare to duel, Antonio encounters them and, mistaking Viola for Sebastian, attempts to halt the duel and gets arrested. Later, Sir Toby and Sir Andrew run across Sebastian, who wins a challenge. Olivia takes Sebastian for Viola/Cesario, pursues him, and gets Sebastian to consent to marry her.

The Duke questions Antonio, and Viola recounts the duel. Antonio speaks of rescuing Cesario (Viola) from the sea. Olivia seeks out her newly betrothed, mistaking Viola for Sebastian. Sirs Toby and Andrew claim that Cesario has committed assault. The estranged siblings recognize one another, and Sebastian clarifies the confusing chain of events. Duke Orsino and Viola pair up, Sebastian and Olivia affirm their vows, and Olivia chastises Sir Toby and Maria (who marry) for mistreating Malvolio, who pledges to avenge them all.

**Declan Donnellan** is joint Artistic Director of Cheek by Jowl. As Associate Director of the National Theatre, his productions included Fuente Ovejuna by Lope de Vega, Sweeney Todd by Stephen Sondheim, The Mandate by Nikolai Erdman, and both parts of Angels in America by Tony Kushner. For the Royal Shakespeare Company he has directed The School for Scandal, King Lear (as the first director of the RSC Academy), and Great Expectations. He has directed Le Cid by Corneille in French, for the Avignon Festival, and at BAM in 1998: Falstaff by Verdi for the Salzburg Festival; and Romeo and Juliet for the Bolshoi Ballet, Moscow, becoming the first UK stage director to work with the Bolshoi (and the first stage director to work with the company since 1938). Other work in Russia includes The Winter's Tale for the Maly Theatre of St Petersburg. In 2000 he and Nick Ormerod (joint Artistic Director of Cheek by Jowl) formed a company of actors in Moscow, whose productions include Boris Godunov, Twelfth Night, and Three Sisters. His book, The Actor and the Target, originally published in Russian, has since been published in French, Spanish, Romanian, and its second English edition was published in October 2005. He has received awards in London, Paris, and New York, including the Olivier for Outstanding Achievement and is a Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres.

Nick Ormerod is joint Artistic Director of Cheek by Jowl. He trained at Wimbledon School of Art and has designed all but one of Cheek by Jowl's productions. Design work in Russia includes; The Winter's Tale (Maly Theatre of St Petersburg), Boris Godunov, Twelfth Night, and Three Sisters (with Cheek by Jowl's sister company in Moscow formed by the Russian Theatre Confederation). In 2003 he designed his first ballet, Romeo and Juliet, for the Bolshoi Ballet, Moscow. He has designed Falstaff (Salzburg Festival), The Rise and Fall of the City of Mahagonny (English National Opera), Martin Guerre (Prince Edward Theatre), Antigone (Old Vic Theatre), Hay Fever (Savoy Theatre) and The School for Scandal (RSC). He also co-adapted

and designed Dickens' *Great Expectations* for the Royal Shakespeare Company.

#### Cast

Vsevolod Boldin (sea captain; Viola's friend) Graduated from the Russian Theatre Academy (GITIS) in 2000. Theater includes Saturday, Sunday, Monday; Alexander Pushkin; Maria Stewart; Tsar Maximillian; Virtual Masquerade; Mary Poppins (all, with Ermolova Theatre); and The Love of Don Perlimplin (the State Army Theatre).

#### Alexey Dadonov (Olivia)

Graduated from the Moscow Art Theatre School in 2001 (Workshop of A. Leontiev). Works as a teacher of theatrical speech and acting in a school studio, Sh.E.S.T. Theater includes *Lady for a Day, Treasure Island, Brigands, Romeo and Juliet, Explicit Polaroids, In the pupil, The Gypsies* and *Inspector General* (all with Pushkin Theatre), and *Three Sisters* (Chekhov International Theatre Festival).

#### Mikhail Dementiev (Curio)

Studied in the Russian Gerasimov State Cinema Institute (VGIK). Theater includes *Three Sisters* (Chekhov International Theatre Festival). Film includes *Khrustalev, the Car; It's Hard to Be God; Leningrad, November; Singer Josephine or Mouse Population*; and *Goose Flesh*.

Dmitry Dyuzhev (Sir Andrew Aguecheek)
In 1995 completed School for Gifted Children.
Graduated from the Russian Theatre Academy (GITIS, Department of Theatre Directors,
Workshop of Mark Zakharov) in 1999. Theater
includes The Romantics, Who Kisses the Princess, Tatiana Repina (Moscow Young Spectator
Theatre (TUZ)), and Boris Godunov (the Chekhov International Theatre Festival). Film includes
The Ark, Brigade, Shnek, 24 Hours, The April,
and Secular Chronicles.

**Alexander Feklistov** (Sir Toby Belch)
Graduated from the Moscow Art Theatre School in 1982. Worked in the Moscow Art Theatre

from 1982—88 and 1995—2001. He was one of the founders of the 5th Moscow Art Theatre Studio. Theater includes *Days of the Turbins*, *The Golovlevs*, *Rose Tattoo* (all at the Moscow Art Theatre), *The Emigrants* (Theatre Studio Chelovek), *Hamlet*, *Boris Godunov*, *Three Sisters* (Chekhov International Theatre Festival), *The Black Prince* (Pushkin Theatre), and *Masquerade* (Fifth Moscow Art Theatre Studio). Film and TV includes *Plumbum or a Dangerous Play*, *A Close Circle*, *Envy of Gods*, *Detachment*, *The Fathers*, *Broken Light*, *Luna Park*, and *Bourgeois' Birthday*.

#### Andrey Kuzichev (Viola)

Graduated from the Russian Theatre Academy (GITIS) in 1996. Worked in the Sphere Theatre in Moscow. Since 1999, has worked for Centre of Dramaturgy and Theatre Directing. Theater includes *Plasticine*, *West Side Story*, *Shopping and Fucking*, *Your Well-Known Writer* (all at the Centre of Dramaturgy and Theatre Directing) and *Three Sisters* (Chekhov International Theatre Festival). Film includes *Investigation Is Led by Experts*. *Twenty Years After*, *Family Secrets*, *A Murderer's Diary*, *Moon Flights*, and *Lines of Fate*. Winner of the Seagull Prize (2002) and the Award of Moskovsky Komsomolets (2003).

#### Ilia Ilin (Maria)

Graduated from the Russian Theatre Academy (GITIS) in 1993 (workshop of A. Borodin). From 1993 till 2000 worked in the Russian Youth Theatre. Theater includes Romeo and Juliet; Captain's Daughter; Trap 46, Size 2; A Lark Is Flying between the Sky and the Earth; Tom Sawyer; Our Small Town; An Evening of Russian Vaudevilles; and King Lear (Russian Youth Theatre); Boris Godunov (the Chekhov International Theatre Festival). Has worked for Radio Russia since 1990. Film and TV include Master Thief, The Little Nothings of Life, and Lady Thief.

#### Yury Makeev (Valentine)

Graduated from the Russian Theatre Academy (RATI) in 2002. Theater Includes *Love of Don Perlimplin* for Theater of the Russian Army and *Platonov* for GITIS Theatre, *Three Sisters* (Chek-

hov International Theatre Festival). Film includes Cobra, Bed Scenes, and A Crushing Force: Overtime, Simple Truths.

#### Sergev Mukhin (Sebastian)

Graduated from the Russian Theatre Academy (GITIS) in 1998. Worked at Mossovet Theatre. Since 2001, has worked for Centre of Dramaturgy and Theatre Directing. Theater includes Wandering Lights, Mon Ami, The Minor, Twelfth Night, The Kitchen, Who is the Last in the List for Love? (all with Mossovet Theatre), Plasticine, Transfer, and Floor Cover (Centre of Dramaturgy and Theatre Directing). Film includes My Sergey, Siberian Barber, Photo, I Am a Murderer, and Don't Even Think About It.

#### **Dmitry Shcherbina** (Malvolio)

Graduated from the Moscow Art Theatre studio in 1993. From 1993 to 1995 worked in the Moscow Art Theatre and Oleg Tabakov Studio. Since 1995 has worked for Mossovet Theatre. Theater Includes *Undina*, *Biloxi Blues*, *Passions by Bumbarash* (all at the Moscow Art Theatre), *Madame Bovary*, *Mon Ami*, *Cyrano de Bergerac*, *King Lear*, *Twelfth Night* (all at the Mossovet Theatre), *Hamlet* and *Boris Godunov* (both, the Chekhov International Theatre Festival). Film includes *The Two Destinies*, *The Black Room*, *Escape from Death*, *Lady Peasant*, *Three Days Outlaw*, and *The Sah's Diamonds*.

#### Vladimir Vdovichenkov (Orsino)

Graduated from the State Cinema Institute (VGIK) in 2001; studied with G.Taratorkin. He currently works for the Moscow Vakhtangov State Academic Theatre. Theater includes *Tsar's Hunting*. Film includes *The Brigade*, *Boomer*, and *Inspiration*.

#### Igor Yasulovich (Feste)

Theater and cinema actor and director, graduated from the Cinema Institute (VGIK, workshop of Professor M. Romm) in 1963. Professor of the Russian Theatre Academy, teaches acting in the musical theater department. Since 1993 has worked in the Moscow Young Spectator Theatre (TUZ). Theater includes *Ivanov and Others*.

Romantics, Tatiana Repina, Thunderstorm, and The Black Monk (all at TUZ), Boris Godunov and Three Sisters (both the Chekhov International Theatre Festival). Film includes Uncle's Dream, Ruslan and Liudmila, Twelve Chairs, There Is No Way Back, Once Twenty Years After, There are Skies Behind the Clouds, There, Over the Horizon, Petersburg Mysteries, and That Very Munghausen.

#### Mikhail Zhigalov (Antonio)

Graduated from the Moscow Chemical Engineering Industry Institute in 1965 and Moscow Children's Theatre drama studio in 1970. From 1970 till 1978 worked in the Moscow Children's Theatre, and has been an actor at Sovremennik theater since 1978. Theater includes *The Merry Wives of Windsor, We Are Performing Schiller, Maria Stewart, Three Comrades, A Sudden Route, Anomaly,* and *Warning to Minor Ships* (Sovremennik Theatre), *Boris Godunov* and *Three Sisters* (both the Chekhov International Theatre Festival). Films include *Petrovka, 38; Start Liquidation; Cania and The Afghan Break*. Honored Artist of Russia (1991).

#### Evgeny Pisarev (Assistant Director)

Actor and director, graduated from the Moscow Art Theatre School (Acting Department) in 1993. Theater includes *Government Inspector*, *Great Gatsby*, *Les Fourberies de Scapin*, *Some Explicit Polaroid* (Chaika Award, 2002) (all at Moscow Pushkin Theatre), and *Old Residential Area* (Tabakov Studio Theatre). With The Pushkin Theatre he has staged *Treasure Island* (by RL Stevenson), *Love and Other Things* (by JD Salinger) and *Borrow the Tenor* (by K. Ludwig; Chaika Award, 2005). Television includes *Kamenskaya-3* and *Turetsky March*. He has been teaching acting at the Moscow Art Theatre School since 1999.

#### Andrey Zavodyuk

Graduated Russian Theatre Academy (GITIS) in 2002. Worked in Lermontov Russian Drama Theatre in Grozny from 1987 till 1990 and in Lunacharsky Drama Theatre in Kuzbass from 1990 till 1999. Since 2000, has worked for Pushkin Theatre, and has had roles in *Belkin's Novels*,

Treasure Island, Some Explicit Polaroid, Government Inspector, Nights of Cabiria, A Midsummer Night's Dream, and The Suicide.

#### The Chekhov International Theatre Festival

Since its creation by the International Confederation of Theatrical Associations in 1992, The Chekhov International Theatre Festival has grown to become one of the most important and prestigious theater events in the world.

Over the course of six festivals in Moscow, the program has given a platform to the work of directors as diverse and eminent as Robert Wilson, Tadashi Suzuki, Heiner Goebbels, Peter Fomenko, Luc Bondy, Peter Stein, Giorgio Strehler, Eimuntas Nekrosius, Robert Sturua, Luca Ronconi, Theodoros Terzopoulos, Bartabas, and Declan Donnellan.

The festival also aims to support and develop the work of emerging Russian practitioners and supports cutting edge and experimental work through its Experimental and Youth Program.

The most recent festival in 2005, showcased work by Théâtre de Complicité, Matthew Bourne's New Adventures, Cloud Gate Theatre of Taiwan, a new production of Sarah Kane's 4.48 Psychosis, and a specially commissioned Russian language production of Chekhov's Three Sisters directed by Declan Donnellan.

The Chekhov Festival aims to capture and celebrate the unique spirit of Russian theater and promotes Moscow as a strong contender for theater capital of the world.

#### David Eden Productions, Ltd

For over fifteen years. David Eden Productions. Ltd. (DEP) has been one of the leading American organizations devoted to producing international work in the United States. In 2005. DEP was responsible for national tours of Propeller Theatre's The Winter's Tale, directed by Edward Hall and Piccolo Teatro di Milano's Arlecchino. In 2004. Eden curated the Ashton Celebration. a two-week retrospective at the Metropolitan Opera House celebrating the 100th birthday of Sir Frederick Ashton that featured sixteen of the master choreographer's ballets. Also in 2004. Eden produced the twelve-city premiere tour of Rezo Gabriadze's Forbidden Christmas or The Doctor and The Patient starring Mikhail Barvshnikov, and the first national US tour of London's Royal Court Theatre's 4.48 Psychosis by Sarah Kane. Other recent critically acclaimed projects of Eden's include national tours of the Batsheva Dance Company (1998 & 2004) and British director Declan Donnellan's Boris Godunov (2003).

In Fall 2006, DEP tours the Batsheva Dance Company and the Gate Theatre Dublin's Waiting for Godot. In the following seasons, DEP will tour Dorcy Rugamba's The Investigation (Fall 2007), the National Theatre's acclaimed double bill of Chatroom and Citizenship (Winter 2008), the State Ballet of Georgia with legendary ballerina Nina Ananiashvili (Summer 2007 and Winter 2008), and the Druid Theatre Company's DruidSynge (Fall 2008). Other highlights include "Russian Village Festival" National Tour (1990, 1991, 1995 & 1997); Lev Dodin's Maly Drama Theater of St. Petersburg's Gaudeamus, BAM Next Wave Festival/National Tour (1994); Kirov Ballet/Vaganova Ballet Academy Project, BAM (1998): Art of the State: Israel at 50 (1998): Gate Theatre Dublin's "Beckett Festival" (2000): Bolshoi Ballet National Tour (2000 & 2002); Island: Arts from Ireland (2000). Brothers and Sisters, Lincoln Center Festival (2000); John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts—Arts of the United Kingdom (Summer 2001); and St. Petersburg State Academic Capella National Tour (2003); among others.
